


Redfish stocks growing

Fishery in unit 1 was 40,000 to 80,000 MT in 1980's

In recent years fishing was from Unit 2; around 5000 MT per year






2024 DFO says 25,000 ton quota (with possible increases subject to advisory ctte)



Redfish fisheries





DFO set Unit 1 quota at 25,000 mt




Increases in volume of redfish will be difficult to market

- Primary usage has been lobster bait
- Most valuable usage is fresh and frozen fillets.
- There is a very small US market for whole fish.
- Iceland successfully exports whole fish.
- It will take several years to begin to find the right markets that will make it profitable to fish



US Market wants fillets; most production not suitable for fillets






Redfish Characteristics

- Long-lived and slow growing
- Current stocks show slower growth curve compared to 1980
- Minimum regulatory size is 22 cm, model size in 2024 is 24-25 cm
- This is mostly for bait and whole fish markets. Expensive to fillet with this size fish.
- Higher value fillet markets require larger fish
 27 cm or higher.




Length frequency from DFO 2021 survey

Market size requirements in US

- Whole fish: 300-500 gram
- Fillets 4-6 (75-100 gram) or 6-8 (55-75 gram) count/lb preferred
- Retail wants fish 27 cm (11 inches) or larger for fresh fillets.



Redfish (ocean perch) competes with West Coast rockfish

- West coast rockfish/ocean perch is around 60,000 tons per year
- US redfish is less than 10% of that volume.
- West coast rockfishes are much larger than Acadian redfish



Buyer survey conducted in 2019

- Redfish is seen as minor part of whitefish complex
- Boneless fillets are most important product form, skinless or skin on
- Fresh is preferred over frozen

- East North Central US is primary market, accounting for 44%.
- Clear demand for MSC certification
- Pricing falls between tilapia/pangasius and cod/haddock




Canadian redfish does not conform to market demands

- Most redfish volume too small for fillets.
- Most redfish will go to whole fish or headless, but market wants fillets.
- Bait market already takes redfish; may not absorb a big increase.
- Bait market preference is for racks from filleted fish.



Iceland exports can provide clues to global market


Iceland redfish catches










Fresh whole goes to EU, Fzn whole to China and Korea






Canada's exports of whole frozen redfish



- Similar to Iceland, Canada ships whole fish to China and Korea.
- In 2023 Canada shipped 1200 tons; while Iceland shipped 783 tons
- To Korea Canada also shipped more than Iceland. But Canada was getting \$.64/lb vs \$1.17/lb for Iceland (USD)




Headless redfish and frozen redfish heads






Skinless fillets: most to EU






Skin on fillets



- Canada and US take redfish heads for bait
- EU takes fresh fillets and skinless fzn fillets
- US & Canada take a portion of skin-on fillets
- Frozen whole fish goes to China and Korea




US uses redfish fillets






US redfish landings around 4,000 tons



- Most US redfish goes to fresh fillet market
- Harvesters use selective gear to try and maximize size



Bait markets in US




- Three types of bait products:

 most valuable are racks left over from filleting
 Redfish heads produced by those using Baader machines for heading are also sold for bait; these are produced in Iceland as well
- Some small redfish are sold whole. These are the least valued





Product forms into US





Fzn fillets are from China via Iceland








US pricing for twice fzn fillets

Options for development

- Will need a market for whole fish
- Skin-on fillets acceptable in US market
- Strong preference for boneless
- Redfish heads can be used for lobster bait.
- Headless redfish goes to a variety of countries.
- Asian markets in US for whole fish could be important



Limited markets available for 25,000 tons.

- Given current redfish markets it is unlikely that the total amount of quota can be caught economically.
- Important to develop some products that can earn sufficient money to make fishing worthwhile.
- Fillets can pay enough for harvesters.
- Lobster bait can take a share of the total catch.



Outlook continued

- Non-bait markets for whole fish or headless fish will be hard to develop, but they are likely the primary market in the future until fillet capacity has built up.
- Important to experiment with redfish product forms on trade missions and in development with overseas partners.
- US will not ever be a large market for whole fish
