Movement of New Brunswick's Population Between 2010 and 2011

<u>Mobility status – Place of residence 1 year ago</u> indicates whether the person lived in the same residence on May 10, 2011, as he or she did one year earlier on May 10, 2010.

- According to the 2011 National Household Survey, roughly 9 out of 10 New Brunswickers aged 1 year and over (89.2%) lived in the same residence in 2011 as they did in 2010. A further 9.2% reported they had moved within the province between 2010 and 2011, while 1.3% indicated they had moved from a different province or territory. A small proportion of the population (0.3%) indicated they had lived outside the country one year earlier.
- Between 2010 and 2011, 9,480 individuals moved to New Brunswick from elsewhere in the country, with the majority of them coming from Ontario (24.9%), Nova Scotia (20.9%), Alberta (17.6%) and Quebec (16.4%).
- At the same time, 10,270 people left New Brunswick for other parts of Canada. Most of these individuals went to Ontario (26.7%), Nova Scotia (18.8%), Alberta (17.4%) and Quebec (16.1%).
- Considering both arrivals to and departures from the province, New Brunswick suffered a net loss of approximately 800 people over the one-year period.
