

Please read both sides of this fact sheet before attempting to apply.

Applications accepted between May 15 and June 9.

End times on June 9:

- Telephone Application Lines - until 7:30 pm AST
- Online Application - until midnight AST
- In person at a Service New Brunswick (SNB) centre or vendor - until close of regular business hours

To apply:

1. Must be 18 years or older at the time of the application
2. Choose a Wildlife Management Zone (WMZ).
3. Have your **NB Outdoors Card number** ** (please ensure your mailing address associated with this card is up to date) and, if paying by credit card, have your **Visa** or **MasterCard** ready.
4. Select one of the options below. **Application fee of \$ 9.55 includes conservation fee and HST.**

The **hours of operation for the telephone application lines** are Monday to Friday from 8:00 am to 7:30 pm and Saturday from 9 am to 1 pm. If you experience difficulties during your call, please stay on the line and an operator will assist you. If you continue to experience difficulty with your application or make an error, please contact Energy and Resource Development (ERD) Fish & Wildlife Branch at (506) 453-3826 during regular business hours (Monday - Friday, 8:15 am to 4:30 pm) before attempting to make another application. The telephone lines will be closed on Monday May 22 due to Victoria Day.

Canadian Forces & Royal Canadian Mounted Police Members

- Canadian Forces and RCMP members residing in New Brunswick may apply for the Resident Moose Draw in person at a SNB centre or through the Fish & Wildlife Licensing system.
- An amendment to the *Fish and Wildlife Act* now allows New Brunswick-born serving members of the Canadian Forces and RCMP to apply for the Resident Moose Draw the same as any New Brunswick resident regardless of where they live or serve. 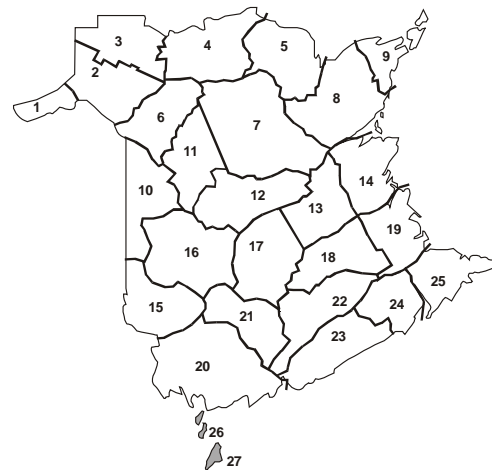
For every five (5) years you have applied unsuccessfully since 1994, you will be placed into a higher pool.

Note: To legally obtain a New Brunswick hunting licence:

- Hunters born on or after January 1, 1981, and all first-time hunters must show proof of a Firearm Safety / Hunter Education Course (gun hunters or a stand-alone Bowhunter Education course (bow/ crossbow hunters).
- Hunters born previous to 1981 may present a previous hunting licence as proof of hunting experience.
- Conservation Education certificates from other province, territories and states are valid in New Brunswick.
- For further information on Firearm Safety/Hunter Education and Bow Hunter Education courses, please contact your local ERD district office.

- You must use your NB Outdoors Card number to check your status in the draw.
- If you are successful in the draw, you may purchase your Moose licence online through the Fish & Wildlife Licensing system, or at an authorized vendor or Service New Brunswick centre after July 4, 2017.

General Information

- It is an offence to apply more than once to the draw
- Only one application per person will be accepted each year.
- Applicants may apply to hunt in only one Wildlife Management Zone (WMZ). Before choosing a zone, familiarize yourself with WMZ boundaries by visiting a ERD office or the ERD website at www.gnb.ca/naturalresources to obtain a WMZ booklet and consult the table on this sheet for 2017 WMZ licence quotas.
- More than one individual may apply from the same telephone number.
- Moose licences are NOT transferable or refundable.
- The 2017 Moose Hunting Season is Tuesday, September 26 to Saturday, September 30.

Facts and Figures

A review of moose hunter applications during the last six years (2011 - 2016) revealed the following:

113,718 different individuals have applied at least once during the six (6) year period.

Of these draw applicants:

24,091 different residents were successfully drawn once;
1,531 different residents were drawn two (2) times;
86 residents were drawn three (3) times; and
3 residents were drawn four (4) times.
