Randy Dickinson is the founding Executive Director for the Premier's Council on the Status of Disabled Persons. The Premier's Council was established in 1982.

In recognition of the many years of service and the tremendous contributions on disability issues in New Brunswick made by Randy over four decades, the Premier's Council has established an annual scholarship. The scholarship is in the amount of **\$2000** and will be awarded to a New Brunswick student with a disability studying in a recognized program at a post-secondary educational institution in New Brunswick.

Eligibility

- Candidates must be residents of the Province of New Brunswick.
- Candidates must be a person with a disability.
- Candidates must have been accepted as a student in a recognized program in a postsecondary institution in New Brunswick.
- Preference will be given to candidates studying in a field associated with disabilities.
- Proof of registration in the program of study will be required before funds are distributed.
- The Randy Dickinson Scholarship may be awarded to a student at the secondary, post-secondary or graduate level.
- The application deadline is May 17th, 2024.
- The successful candidate will be selected by the Premier's Council on Disabilities.
