New Brunswick Tradesperson Receives the Darryl Cruickshank Memorial Award

William Young received the Darryl Cruickshank Memorial Award from the Canadian Council of Directors of Apprenticeship (CCDA), at the Canadian Apprenticeship Forum's 2012 Sixth National Conference, held in Regina, Sask. Young is the executive director of the Masonry Industry Association of Atlantic Canada and honoured for his significant contribution to apprenticeship in Canada.

"Mr. Young has shown inspirational leadership in the promotion and development of training for aspiring tradespersons here in New Brunswick," said Post-Secondary Education, Training and Labour Minister Martine Coulombe. "We are pleased his efforts are being recognized by this prestigious award."

Young's accomplishments include:

- program provide developing in-house bricklaving an training to developing an in-house training program to provide bricklaying skills; contributing to the development of the bricklaying trade in New Brunswick;
- contributing to the creation of a bursary program for bricklayer apprentices; and
- mentoring several apprentices who have gone on to become mentors themselves.

"Mr. Young has been a lifetime advocate for the apprenticeship program," said Coulombe. "His dedication working with government and all stakeholders to develop New Brunswick certification through the Interprovincial Standards Red Seal Program is one example of how collaboration benefits both workers and employers."

This second biennial Darryl Cruickshank Memorial Award honours contributions made by the late Darryl Cruickshank to the Interprovincial Standards Red Seal Program and recognizes the contribution of industry to the skilled trades.

The Interprovincial Standards Red Seal Program is a joint initiative of provincial, territorial, and federal governments and is guided by the Canadian Council of Directors of Apprenticeship. The Red Seal is industry's standard of excellence for the skilled trades.

Always determined to ensure apprentices who were challenged by the regular learning program received the help they needed, he set
