Subject: Coach Certification – Games of La Francophonie
Effective: May 2005

1.0 Purpose

- 1.1. This policy establishes the National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP) requirements of Games of La Francophonie coaches.
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2.0 Application

- 2.1 This policy applies to all coaches appointed by provincial sport organizations to coach their respective Games of La Francophonie teams.
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3.0 Definitions

- 3.1 NCCP Competition Development Certification – Acknowledged as full completion of theory, technical and practical components of the level 3 National Coaching Certification Program, Competition stream, Development context, (Certified Status).
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4.0 Legal Authority

- 4.1 *The Youth Assistance Act*
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5.0 Goals / Principles

- 5.1 The Sport and Recreation Branch of the Department of Healthy and Inclusive Communities strongly believes that better coaches develop better athletes, and equally believes that the National Coaching Certification Program is the best way to develop better coaches. In order to help ensure that Games of La Francophonie coaches are the best possible for Games of La Francophonie level athletes, Team Canada-New Brunswick has implemented minimum certification requirements.
- 5.2 The coaching certification requirements for the Games of La Francophonie are accepted and managed by Chef de Missions, National/Provincial Sport Organizations, coaches and the Coaching Association of Canada.

6.0 Requirements / Standards

6.1 All Games of La Francophonie coaches are required to have full NCCP Competition Development (theory, technical and practical), (Certified Status) a minimum of 90 days prior to the opening ceremonies of the Games of La Francophonie.

7.0 Guidelines / Recommendations

7.1 Team Canada-New Brunswick's Chef de Mission monitors the implementation of the coaching requirement.
