EXPRESS ENTRY STREAM


The province of New Brunswick is now accepting EOIs (Expressions of Interest) under the <u>New Brunswick</u> <u>Express Entry Stream</u> from individuals who **have been residing in NB for at least 6 months** and are currently working full-time or have an offer of full-time employment from a New Brunswick employer.

** Your employer does not have to support your application through the NB Express Entry Stream – your NB employment is your connection to New Brunswick.

Starting March 1, 2024, EOIs with the following NOCs will not be accepted:

- 62010 Retail Sales Supervisors
- 60030 Restaurant and food service managers
- 62020 Food Service Supervisors
- 63200 Cooks

Candidates with experience under the above NOCs can use the AIP or NBPNP- Skilled Worker Stream



Answer YES to the following question: Have you been residing in New Brunswick for at least 6 months and are currently working full-time or have an offer of full-time employment from a New Brunswick employer?

Once your EOI is successfully submitted, contact us at entree.express.entry@gnb.ca with the subject line: Employment in NB - EE EOI.

Include in your message:

- Your INB Profile Number (Candidate ID #);
- Your full name, as it appears in your INB profile;
- Your federal Express Entry Profile Number (E00*******) and job seeker validation code
- Name of employer and position

Once we review your EOI in INB, you may be issued an ITA (Invitation to Apply) via your INB notification centre. The province reserves the right to extend ITAs to candidates that have the highest probability of becoming economically established.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THE NEW BRUNSWICK EXPRESS ENTRY STREAM THAT YOU SHOULD KNOW BEFORE APPLYING:

(Complete program information is available in Your Guide to the New Brunswick Express Entry Stream)

(1) Work Experience

The minimum work experience required for this program is at least one year of full-time paid work (1,560 hours total) or an equal amount of part-time work. The work experience must be in the following National Occupational Classification (NOC) TEER categories:

- TEER 0
- TEER 1
- TEER 2
- TEER 3

Your work experience can be in Canada or abroad.

Your work experience needs to be in the same type of job (have the same NOC) as the job you wish to use for your immigration application.

Your work experience must be paid work.

You can meet the one year (1,560 hours) of **continuous** work requirement in multiple ways:

- Full-time at one job: 30 hours per week for 12 months
- Full-time at more than one job: 30 hours per week for 12 months at more than one job
- Equal amount in part-time: 15 hours per week for 24 months

(2) Language Testing

All applicants submitting an application through the NB Express Entry Stream must have a valid language test in English or French, that was administered by a designated IRCC testing agency and that is less than 18 months old at the time your application is submitted to the province of New Brunswick. Please note you must have obtained a minimum score equal to or greater than:

- a Canadian Language Benchmark (CLB) 7 for English; or,
- Niveaux de compétence linguistique canadiens (NCLC) 7 for French

The following language tests are accepted for immigration purposes:

- IELTS General Training
- <u>CELPIP</u>
- PTE Core
- TEF CANADA
- TCF pour le Canada

(3) Education

If you have not graduated from a Canadian institution, you *must* provide a copy of an Educational Credential Assessment completed by a designated organization:

- Comparative Education Service (CES)
- International Credential Assessment Service of Canada (ICAS)
- World Education Services (WES)
- International Qualifications Assessment Service (IQAS)
- International Credential Evaluation Service (ICES)
- Medical Council of Canada (professional body for doctors)
- Pharmacy Examining Board of Canada (professional body for pharmacists)

If you have completed your education in Canada, you do not need an educational credential assessment.

You may be eligible for additional points under adaptability if you meet the following criteria: You completed at least two academic years of full-time study (in a program at least two years long) at a secondary or post-secondary school in New Brunswick. The points are awarded based on the length of the program. Therefore, the condensed programs will not be considered.

(4) Intent to reside in NB

You should apply for immigration through New Brunswick only if you intend to live and work in the province.

(5) Proof of funds

Settlement funds are not required for **Open Work Permit** holders with a **minimum one-year work experience** (in TEER 0,1, 2, or 3) **in Canada** and who meet all <u>Canadian Experience Class (CEC)</u> Program requirements.

** If you have not worked in Canada for a minimum of one year, you are required to show proof of funds.
