Priority will be given to Element A - Higher yielding cranberry varieties or those with improved marketability.

All applications for Element A will be reviewed after the application deadline (July 31st, 2024). If the total number of eligible acres requested in approved projects exceeds the annual funding allotment for the program, funding will be prorated.

The maximum contribution under the Cranberry Industry Development Program will be \$45,000.00 per year per applicant.

Claim for reimbursement must be submitted no later than January 31, 2025.
