



Medical Liaison (Volunteer Position)

The Medical Liaison is an integral part of Team NB's Mission Staff. They are not assigned to a particular sport, except in unique circumstances, but provide general support to Team NB and all sports. The Medical Liaison will possess expertise and experience in the medical, therapeutic or sports medicine field.

The Medical Liaison will also possess strong interpersonal and organizational skills; knowledge of New Brunswick's amateur sport system; interest in and enthusiasm for Games and working in a multi-sport environment; ability to operate independently and in a team environment; willingness to perform functions and duties outside of their assignment; and an ability to provide excellent service to Team NB.

General Responsibilities:

- Attend the full two weeks (18 days) of the Games
 - Preference will be given to those individuals who can commit to the entire duration of the Games; however, we will consider single week applications.
- Attend mission staff meetings and team functions (including two leadership meetings; conference calls as needed; and the Team NB weekend rally prior to the Games)
- Become familiar with Team NB policies, including Code of Conduct and disciplinary procedures
- Where appropriate, work collaboratively (holistic approach) with the Canadian Sports Centre – Atlantic and/or other medical and sports science professionals who are providing pre-Games services to Team NB sports (eg. Fitness consultants, dieticians, local medical experts)
- Liaise with Host Society's medical team on all medical injuries of Team NB at Games
- Provide follow-up support/information to injured Team NB members, their parents/families and the Chef de Mission
- Attend daily Mission staff meetings at Games
- Perform other duties as required in support of Team NB

Skills Required

- Expertise and experience in the medical, therapeutic or sports medicine field.
- Exceptional organizational skills and the ability to multi-task
- Demonstrate the ability, based on past experiences, to work long hours in a fast pace environment.
- Strong Interpersonal skills
- Bilingualism will be considered a strong asset
