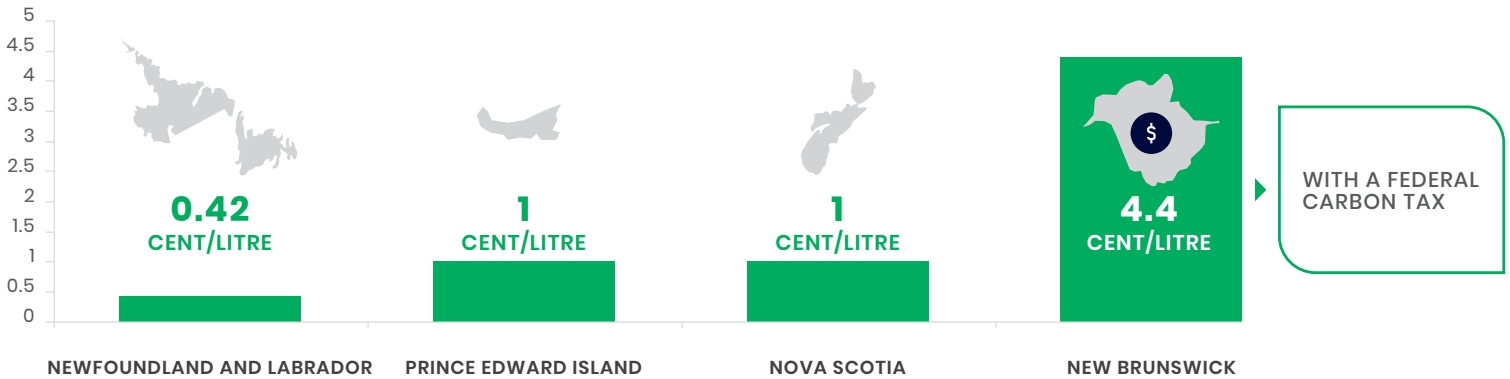


# WHY A CARBON TAX ISN'T FAIR TO NEW BRUNSWICK

## IMPACT ON GASOLINE PRICES FROM THE CARBON TAX IN 2019



IMPACT ON	OTHER PROVINCES THAT DEVELOPED THEIR OWN CARBON PLAN	NEW BRUNSWICK
<b>HOME HEATING FUELS</b>	Exempt in both Newfoundland and Labrador and Prince Edward Island. Minimal impact in Nova Scotia.	New Brunswickers will pay a carbon tax on all home heating fuels, including oil, propane and natural gas, beginning in April 2019 under the federal plan.
<b>FUELS USED IN FORESTRY OPERATIONS</b>	Exempt in Newfoundland and Labrador. Minimal impact expected under Nova Scotia's and Prince Edward Island's approved plans.	New Brunswickers will pay the full federal carbon tax. This will mean millions of dollars in additional costs that will be paid mainly by small entrepreneurs and private woodlot owners.
<b>COMPETITIVENESS OF INDUSTRY</b>	Greater protection for export industries.	Despite being one of the most export-dependant provinces, there is very little recognition or protection for New Brunswick's export industries under the federal plan. This means New Brunswick companies will be disadvantaged compared to our neighbors.
