Now eligible

Individuals who are immunocompromised



Residents of nursing homes



Residents of adult residential facilities



Health-care workers

mRNA COVID-19 booster dose available only if six months have passed since second dose



First Nation individuals

mRNA COVID-19 booster dose available only if six months have passed since second dose



Individuals 65 and older

mRNA COVID-19 booster dose available only if six months have passed since second dose



School personnel

mRNA COVID-19 booster dose available only if six months have passed since second dose



Individuals who have received one or two doses of the AstraZeneca vaccine, regardless of age

Eligible to receive an mRNA COVID-19 booster dose if 28 days have passed since their second dose



Individuals who received a mixed vaccine schedule and must travel outside of North America for essential reasons

Eligible to receive an mRNA COVID-19 booster dose if 28 days have passed since their second dose and they have a letter that shows their travel outside North America is for work, school or a medical appointment
