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GENERAL INFORMATION

The views expressed in this report are those of external GNB participants for consideration by the Government of New Brunswick.

CONTEXT

In 2015 AND 2016, the New Brunswick Jobs Board Secretariat (JBS) held a series of opportunities summits to better define opportunities for economic development and employment growth in the province. Twenty-two summits covering a variety of topics were held in the province.

Engaged citizens, entrepreneurs, leaders of non-profit organizations and government representatives discussed and imagined new avenues for various sectors of New Brunswick society. They also discussed our opportunities for growth and social advancement from a national and global perspective.

The fruits of these discussions helped the JBS develop The New Brunswick Economic Growth Plan, released in September 2016. The plan is based on five pillars:

- People
- Innovation
- Capital
- Infrastructure
- Agility

As promised, the JBS organized a second round of opportunities summits to put into practice the notion of open government. To establish the concept of open government, three phases are required: participation - transparency - collaboration.

The first round consisted of participation. The second round is based on transparency and lays the foundation for greater collaboration between citizens and government.

During this summit, the Department of Energy and Resource Development gave an account of what had been accomplished since the first summit held on December 15, 2015. They reported on the issues that received further attention and presented the work accomplished on each issue.

OBJECTIVES

The summit had the following goals:

Accountability and transparency

- Share information on government decisions and actions related to the initial summit input.
- Provide access to interested people who could not attend at the summit in person.

Improvement and collaboration

- Capture input to improve current strategies and initiatives.
- Identify opportunities to collaborate on priorities going forward.

Participant experience

- Participants had a positive experience and felt their contributions were valued.
- Participants felt heard.

SUMMIT AGENDA AND PARTICIPANTS

The 2nd Opportunities Summit on mines was held in Juniper, in Carleton-Victoria County on April 20, 2017. Thirty-eight participants (including representatives from the provincial government) talked about the possibilities available to the province in the energy sector and on ways to better collaborate on issues.

ONLINE PARTICIPATION

The Web was used in order to allow for the participation of as many people as possible. The presentations on the State of the economy, on the Economic Growth Plan and that of the Department (PETL) were streamed live. At the end of the day, the premier's remarks were also presented in real time at <http://www.opengovnb.ca/en> These presentations are still available on the site.

Social media were also used. Followers of the [OpengovNB/GouvertNB](#) page on Facebook were informed about the summit. On Twitter ([@GNBvousrepond](#), [@GNBreplies](#)), followers were able to follow parts of the conversations since the major topics of discussion were shared throughout the day.

SUMMARY OF DISCUSSIONS: WHAT WE LIKE AND WHAT'S MISSING

Participants formed groups of 5-6 people to discuss details presented by the Department. They were asked to reply to these questions: *How have these actions responded to your needs and why? Have we forgotten anything? What other actions should we prioritize and why?*

The following are comments made by participants on the actions undertaken by the department, as well as on items that are missing. They are grouped according to the larger themes brought up during the discussions.

ON TAX CREDITS AND FINANCIAL AID PROGRAMS

- People in the industry need to be better informed on available programs, grants and financing.
- It would be useful to create a web space grouping all government programs, making it easier to consult what's available.
- We must continue to support mining operations that are just starting out.

ON DATA AND THE GIS (GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEMS)

- The GIS data must be complete in order to be better utilized.
- Access to information is important, but training would be useful to help users access data from GIS, LIDAR, etc.

ON EDUCATION AND TRAINING

- If it is done well and includes a social license to operate, mining exploration is important and crucial to the province's economy.
- Trades need to be reintroduced into the classroom to allow for a greater number of students to discover the mining industry. We need to engage them at a younger age so that they may develop an interest for the mining industry.
- There needs to be an increase in financial support for training.
- There needs to be a thorough analysis of training needs – what are the needs of the industry? Integrate elements at an early age.

ON REGULATIONS

- Efforts must be made to streamline the regulation process (ex: timber licenses, coordination of federal and provincial regulations).
- A pre-approval process for licenses could facilitate the work of explorers.
- Reduce the tax rate of small businesses from 15 to 0%.
- We need to involve First Nations communities as necessary; they should be engaged earlier in the process.
- It was noted that it is difficult to obtain information on large mining projects.

OTHER POINTS

- Concrete targets must be identified for the industry's development and for projects already being developed and operated.
- There is a lack of information or clarity about the results of the harmonization of regulations within the Atlantic Provinces.
- Access to capital is an issue that hasn't been addressed in the government's efforts.
- We need to compile all information on a single Website (ex: gnb.ca) to facilitate finding information.
- It would be interesting to explore what is done elsewhere in the country with respect to help to junior mining operations as well as major mining corporations.

SUMMARY OF DISCUSSIONS: HOW CAN WE COLLABORATE?

Following the initial discussion, overall themes emerged and became topics for further discussion by participants. This portion of the summit was a first step toward reinforcing collaboration between all stakeholders, whether government or community.

Once the themes were identified, participants were invited to join the conversation that appealed to them to answer four questions:

1. How can we better collaborate on this?

2. Is there anything currently available that can be used as leverage?

3. How can we become involved?

4. What are the next steps?

TAX CREDITS

How can we better collaborate?

- Establish a multi-level approach with partners and the supply chain.
- Extend the discussion to other stakeholders.

Is there anything currently available that can be used as leverage?

- Increase financing offered via the Prospector Assistance Program to more than two million dollars annually.
- Double financing for the Junior Mining Assistance Program.
- Use of flow-through shares and other tax incentives.

What are the next steps?

- Establishment of a Business development agent position devoted exclusively to the mining industry.
- Establish a specific classification for mining research and development, and use the definition established by the federal government.
- Set a tax credit of 25% in research and development for investors.
- Decrease the tax rate of small businesses to 0% for the next 15 years, especially for those who are not owned by large mining enterprises.

DATA AND GIS (GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEM)

How can we better collaborate?

- Provide information on databases already in existence.
- Involve the industry in an effort to compile all data collected and ensure conformity in data that is submitted.

Is there anything currently available that can be used as leverage?

- It is important to adapt our data to industry standards.
- Take advantage of new technologies applied in the industry.

How can we become involved?

- By acting like beta testers for new technological tools and data platforms.
- By collaborating with university researchers.

What are the next steps?

- Ensure that projects currently under development are completed.
- Establish a database of current drilling operations.
- Ensure continuity in the geoscientific field because several specialists are close to professional retirement age.

EDUCATION AND TRAINING

How can we better collaborate?

- Identify partners and involve them more.
- Establish a concerted approach with all post-secondary institutions that are linked to this field.

Is there anything currently available that can be used as leverage?

- The recent children's book on the mining industry distributed in schools is a positive step towards a better understanding of the industry.
- Organize visits to exploration sites in order to pique interest in the industry.
- Take advantage of the earth sciences programs at the University of New Brunswick and the NBCC to promote the industry.
- Engage young people earlier in life, in school.

How can we become involved?

- Industry members are willing to visit schools to talk about their work.
- Improve and adapt training opportunities to the needs of students and the industry.
- Invest new funds in training.

What are the next steps?

- Improve technical course offerings in the school system (industrial courses).
- Involve the mining industry early in the school system, especially in high school.
- Ensure there is greater visibility for the mining industry on a global basis.
- Set up additional funding for training.

UNIFORMIZATION AND HARMONIZATION OF REGULATIONS

How can we become involved?

- By participating in the government's review process, especially when it comes to assessing environmental impacts.

What are the next steps?

- Review the make-up of the standing committee on the mining industry and the environment (Department of Energy and Resource Development, Executive Council Office, Department of Transport and

Infrastructure, Aboriginal Affairs Secretariat, Environment and Local Governments and the Government of Canada)

- Clarify, map out and automate the steps to create a more fluid and simple process. (Environmental impact, watercourse alteration permits, etc.)

ENGAGEMENT WITH FIRST NATIONS

How can we better collaborate?

- Allow the industry to share ideas on the guide for the approval process for mining activities.
- Ensure investments are predictable to better plan for development in the sector.

Is there anything currently available that can be used as leverage?

- The public must better understand the issue of mining exploration in New Brunswick and we need to better understand the needs and priorities of First Nations.
- Do a better job of involving First Nations through their Natural Resources Coordinators.
- Seize the momentum and demonstrate clear results of engagement with First Nations.

How can we become involved?

- By participating fully in the process.

What are the next steps?

- Review the guide.
- Coordinate a meeting with all First Nations Natural Resources Coordinators.

NEXT STEPS

SUMMARY REPORT



Global warming has been happening for as long as the continental ice sheets started melting (25,000 to 50,000 years ago) and inundated the continental shelves (which were above water at one point) with an average of more than 65 metres of water.
