



# Report on Student Outcomes and School Climate

## NB Schools - Elementary (4-5) Fall 2017

### New Brunswick Anglophone Schools Highlights

Your version of the **OurSCHOOL** student survey measures 21 indicators based on the most recent research on school and classroom effectiveness. This report provides highlights based on data from 9,026 students in 133 schools that participated in the survey between 2 Nov. 2017 and 19 Dec. 2017.

The results for the province are based on last year's results for all students using The Learning Bar Survey for grade levels assessed by this province, and are compared with Canadian norms. The calculation of the district average represents the results for an equal number of boys and girls at each grade level assessed.

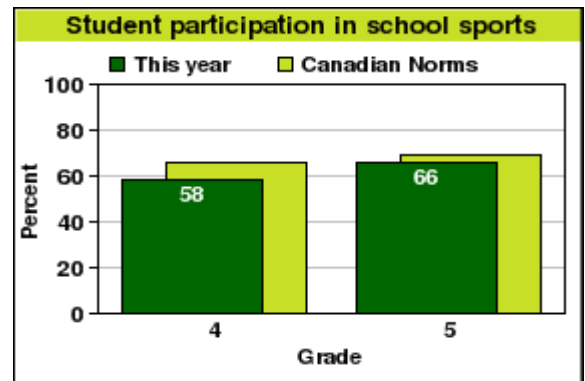

## Social-Emotional Outcomes

### Student participation in school sports

Students who play sports with an instructor at school, other than in a gym class.

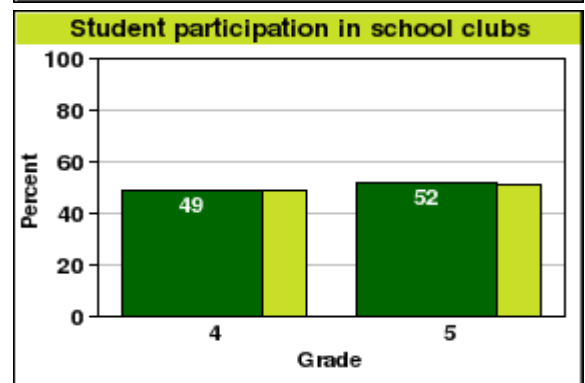
- 62% of students in this province had a high rate of participation in sports; the Canadian norm for these grades is 67%.
- 57% of the girls and 67% of the boys in this province had a high rate of participation in sports. The Canadian norm for girls is 65% and for boys is 69%.



### Student participation in school clubs

Students who take part in art, drama, or music groups; school clubs; or a school committee.

- 50% of students in this province had a high rate of participation in clubs; the Canadian norm for these grades is 50%.
- 58% of the girls and 43% of the boys in this province had a high rate of participation in clubs. The Canadian norm for girls is 57% and for boys is 43%.

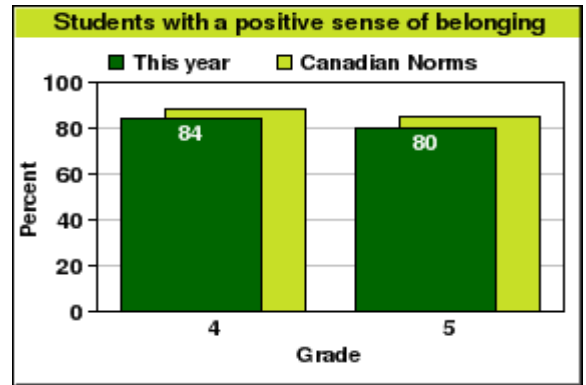


## Social-Emotional Outcomes

### Students with a positive sense of belonging

Students who feel accepted and valued by their peers and by others at their school.

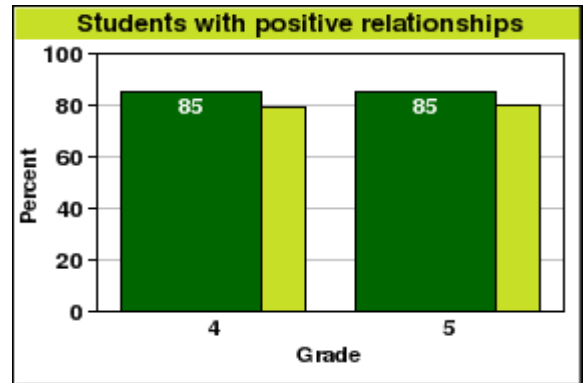
- 82% of students in this province had a high sense of belonging; the Canadian norm for these grades is 86%.
- 83% of the girls and 81% of the boys in this province had a high sense of belonging. The Canadian norm for girls is 87% and for boys is 85%.



### Students with positive relationships

Students who have friends at school they can trust and who encourage them to make positive choices.

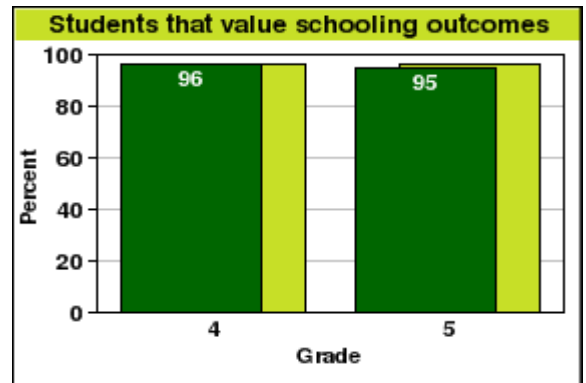
- In this province, 85% of students had positive relationships; the Canadian norm for these grades is 80%.
- 88% of the girls and 82% of the boys in this province had positive relationships. The Canadian norm for girls is 83% and for boys is 77%.



### Students that value schooling outcomes

Students who believe that education will benefit them personally and economically, and will have a strong bearing on their future.

- 96% of students in this province valued school outcomes; the Canadian norm for these grades is 96%.
- 97% of the girls and 95% of the boys in this province valued school outcomes. The Canadian norm for girls is 97% and for boys is 95%.

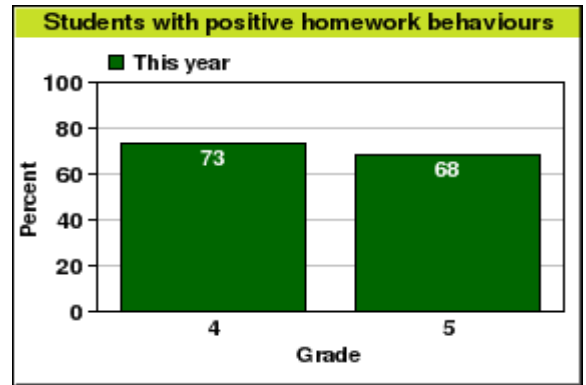


## Social-Emotional Outcomes

### Students with positive homework behaviours

Students who do homework for their classes with a positive attitude and in a timely manner.

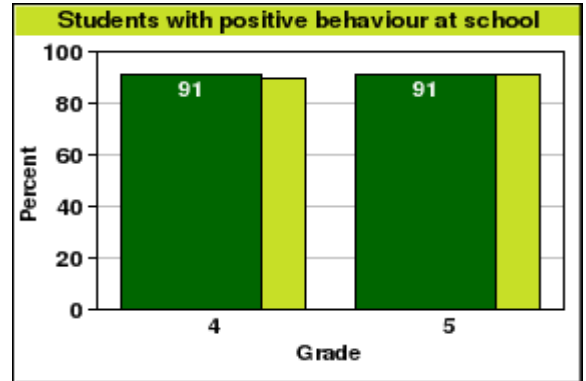
- In this province, 70% of students had positive homework behaviours.
- 78% of the girls and 63% of the boys in this province had positive homework behaviours.



### Students with positive behaviour at school

Students that do not get in trouble at school for disruptive or inappropriate behaviour.

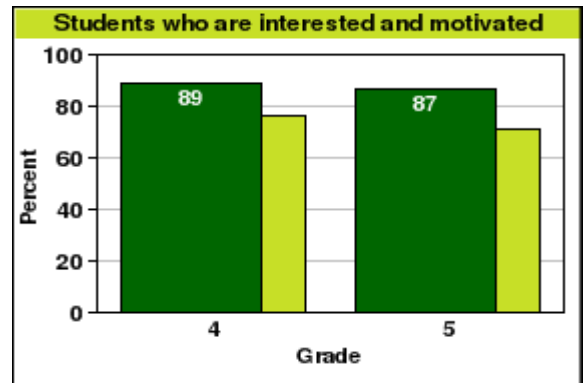
- In this province, 91% of students had positive behaviour; the Canadian norm for these grades is 91%.
- 96% of the girls and 86% of the boys in this province with positive student behaviour at school. The Canadian norm for girls is 95% and for boys is 86%.



### Students who are interested and motivated

Students who are interested and motivated in their learning.

- 88% of students in this province were interested and motivated; the Canadian norm for these grades is 74%.
- 91% of the girls and 85% of the boys in this province were interested and motivated. The Canadian norm for girls is 77% and for boys is 71%.

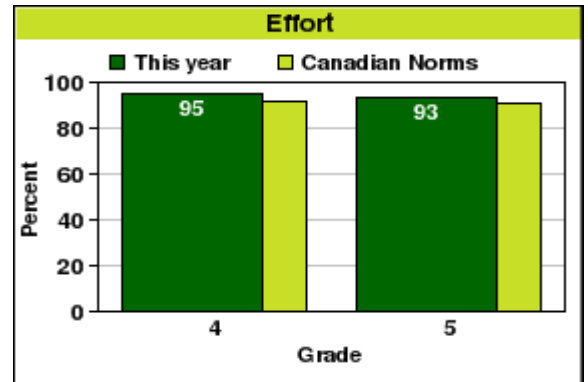


## Social-Emotional Outcomes

### Effort

Students who try hard to succeed in their learning.

- 94% of students in this province tried hard to succeed; the Canadian norm for these grades is 92%.
- 96% of the girls and 92% of the boys in this province tried hard to succeed. The Canadian norm for girls is 94% and for boys is 90%.

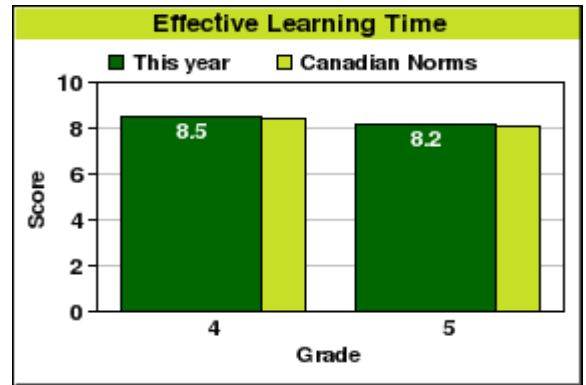


## DRIVERS of Student Outcomes

### Effective Learning Time

Important concepts are taught well, class time is used efficiently, and homework and evaluations support course objectives.

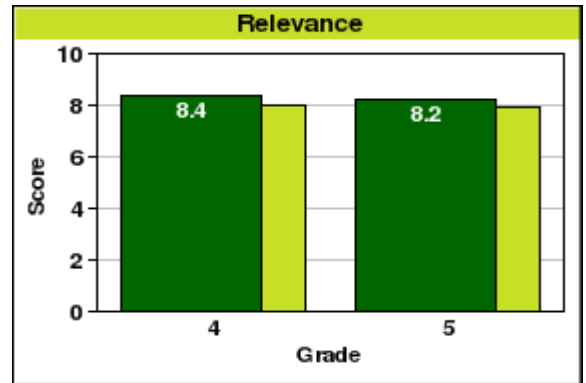
- In this province, students rated effective classroom learning time 8.4 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 8.2.
- In this province, effective classroom learning time was rated 8.5 out of 10 by girls and 8.2 out of 10 by boys. The Canadian norm for girls is 8.3 and for boys is 8.2.



### Relevance

Students who find classroom instruction relevant to their everyday lives.

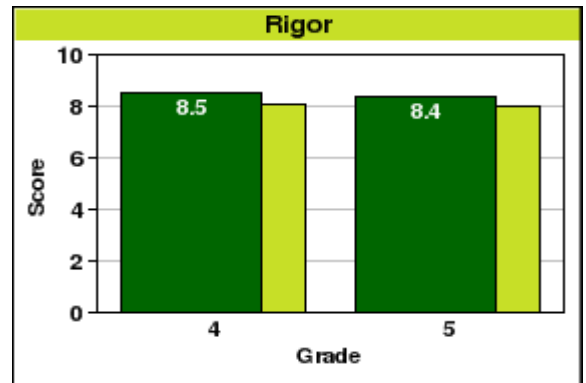
- In this province, students rated relevance 8.3 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 8.
- In this province, relevance was rated 8.5 out of 10 by girls and 8.1 out of 10 by boys. The Canadian norm for girls is 8.1 and for boys is 7.9.



### Rigor

Students who find the classroom instruction is well-organized, with a clear purpose, and with immediate and appropriate feedback that helps them learn.

- In this province, students rated rigor 8.5 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 8.
- In this province, rigor was rated 8.7 out of 10 by girls and 8.3 out of 10 by boys. The Canadian norm for girls is 8.1 and for boys is 8.

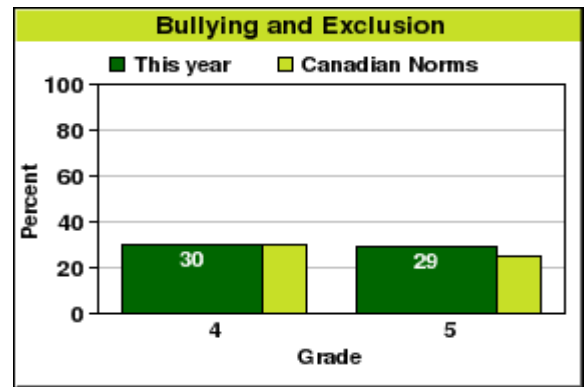


**DRIVERS of Student Outcomes**

**Bullying and Exclusion**

Students who are subjected to physical, social, or verbal bullying, or are bullied over the internet.

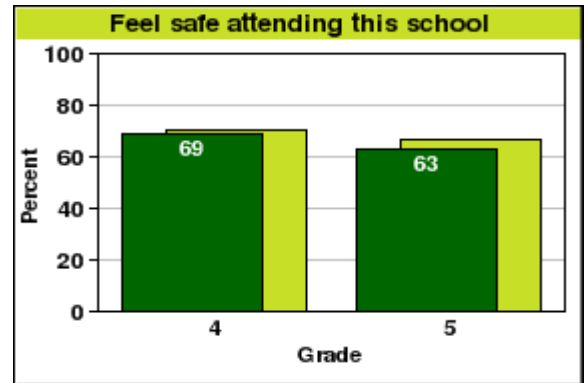
- 30% of students in this province were victims of moderate to severe bullying in the previous month; the Canadian norm for these grades is 28%.
- 26% of the girls and 33% of the boys in this province were victims of moderate to severe bullying in the previous month. The Canadian norm for girls is 28% and for boys is 28%.



**Feel safe attending this school**

Students who feel safe at school as well as going to and from school.

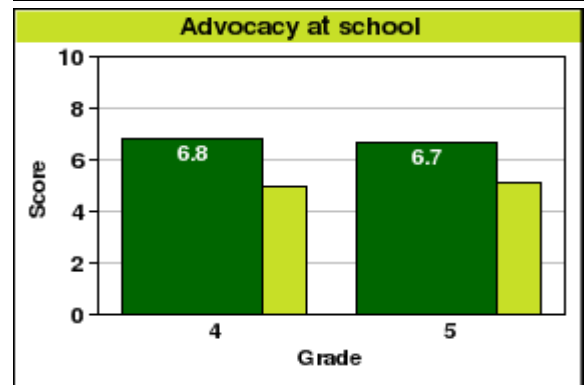
- 66% of students felt safe attending the province; the Canadian norm for these grades is 69%.
- 69% of the girls and 63% of the boys felt safe attending the province. The Canadian norm for girls is 68% and for boys is 70%.



**Advocacy at school**

Students who feel they have someone at school who consistently provides encouragement and can be turned to for advice.

- In this province, students rated advocacy at school 6.8 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 5.1.
- In this province, advocacy at school was rated 6.8 out of 10 by girls and 6.7 out of 10 by boys. The Canadian norm for girls is 5.1 and for boys is 5.1.

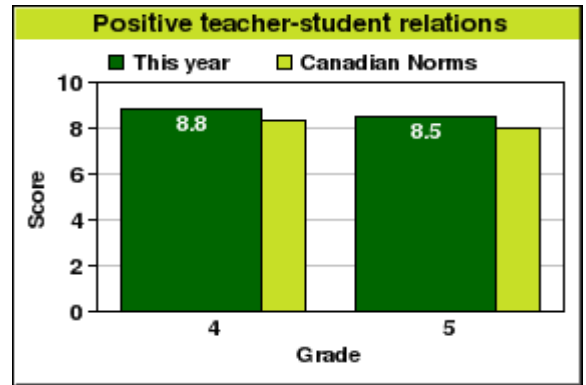


**DRIVERS of Student Outcomes**

**Positive teacher-student relations**

Students who feel teachers are responsive to their needs, and encourage independence with a democratic approach.

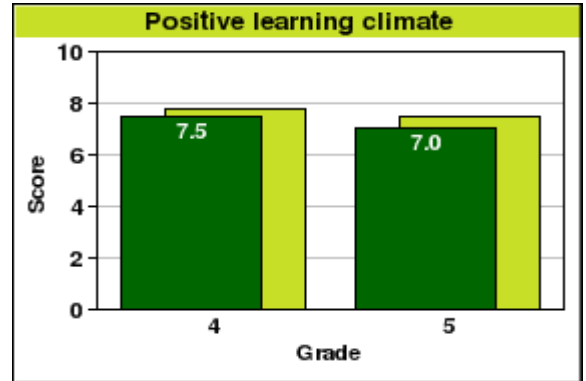
- In this province, positive teacher-student relations were rated 8.6 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 8.1.
- In this province, positive teacher-student relations were rated 8.8 out of 10 by girls and 8.4 out of 10 by boys. The Canadian norm for girls is 8.2 and for boys is 8.



**Positive learning climate**

There are clear rules and expectations for classroom behaviour. Students understand these and teachers maintain high expectations that they be followed.

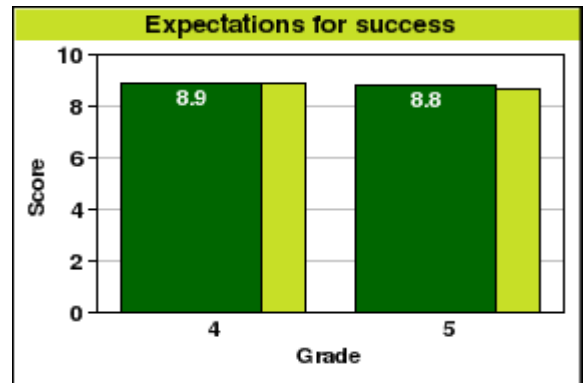
- In this province, students rated disciplinary climate of the classroom 7.3 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 7.6.
- In this province, disciplinary climate of the classroom was rated 7.3 out of 10 by girls and 7.2 out of 10 by boys. The Canadian norm for girls is 7.7 and for boys is 7.6.



**Expectations for success**

The school staff emphasizes academic skills and hold high expectations for all students to succeed.

- In this province, students rated teachers' expectations for academic success 8.8 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 8.8.
- In this province, teachers' expectations for academic success were rated 8.9 out of 10 by girls and 8.7 out of 10 by boys. The Canadian norm for girls is 8.9 and for boys is 8.7.

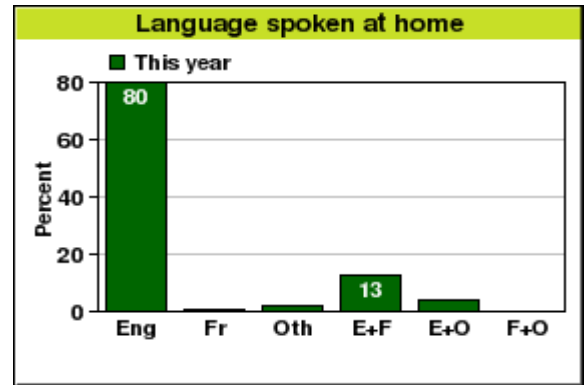


## Demographic Factors

### Language spoken at home

Students are asked to indicate the language they speak most often at home.

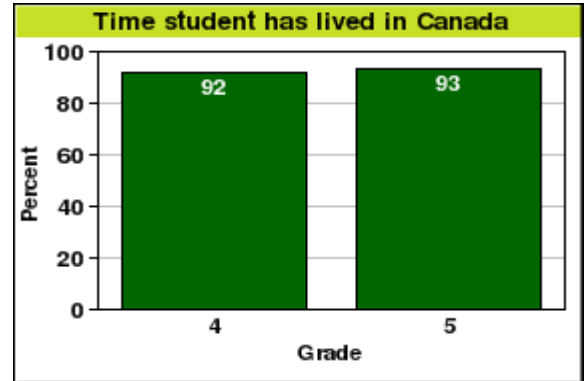
- 80% of students in this province speak English at home.
- 1% of students in this province speak French at home.
- 2% of students in this province speak other languages at home.
- 13% of students in this province speak English and French at home.
- 4% of students in this province speak English and another language at home.
- 0% of students in this province speak French and another language at home.



### Time student has lived in Canada

Students who were born in Canada.

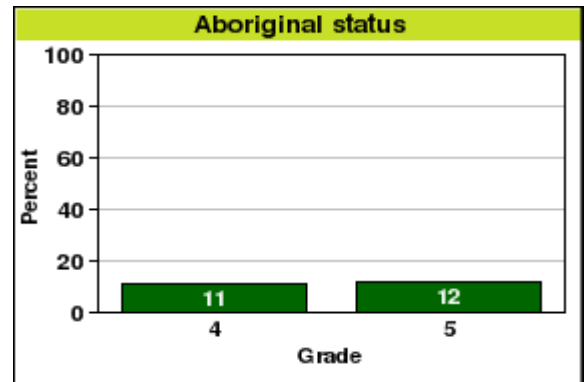
- 92% of students in this province were born in Canada.
- 93% of the girls and 92% of the boys in this province were born in Canada.



### Aboriginal status

Students who are of Aboriginal origin, that is, First Nations, Métis, or Inuk.

- 12% of students in this province are of Aboriginal origin.
- 12% of the girls and 12% of the boys in this province are of Aboriginal origin.



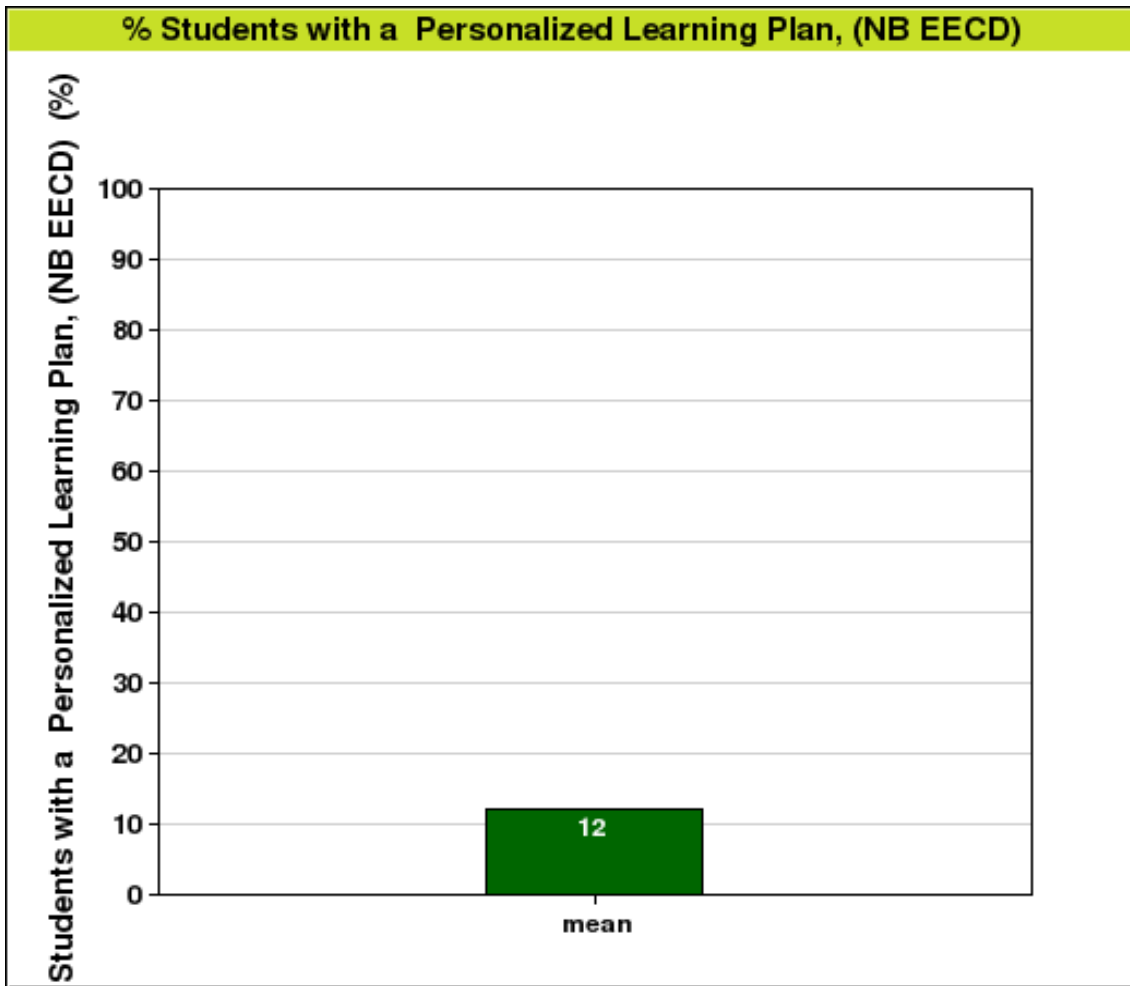
