Graduates of Certified College Programs and
University Students Second-year and Above,

Supply teachers are needed in anglophone schools around New Brunswick.

Graduates from certified (recognised) college programs in all disciplines and university students entering their second-year programs and above from all faculties are eligible to apply for local supply teaching permits with the (anglophone) school districts.

Depending on the year you are in, or your life experience, the daily gross pay is between \$135.69 and \$200.00. This opportunity offers both a part-time job and the chance to gain valuable work experience during the school year and, for many of you, the May and June months when most post-secondary classes are finished (with the option to continue into the fall).

The Department of Education and Early Childhood Development (EECD) is prepared to cover the \$40 local permit fee for successful applicants.

Here is the check list of what is needed to apply:

- Reading about EECD's [Policy 701](#) and filling out (and printing) the form [here](#).
- Contacting your local police force for a criminal records check.
- Resume.
- Two references listing telephone number and an email address.

Successful applicants will be able to choose which anglophone districts they wish to work in. Please note that if selected, and before getting paid, it will be necessary to show either proof of graduation (diploma), or a transcript if still a continuing student.

Approved supply teaching permits will run until June 2023.
