Sustainability Principles



Establishing Principles of Sustainability is the first step towards developing a Sustainability Plan for your community.

Many communities begin with a basic set of principles, such as the Melbourne Principles as explained on the next slide, and modify these for their own community.

These principles provide a starting place and guide further development of the sustainability plan.



The Melbourne Principles

- 1. Provide a **long-term vision** for cities based on: sustainability; intergenerational, social, economic and political equity; and their individuality.
- 2. Achieve long-term economic and social security.
- 3. Recognize the **intrinsic value of biodiversity and natural ecosystems**, and protect and restore them.
- 4. Enable communities to **minimize their ecological footprint**.
- 5. Build on the **characteristics of ecosystems** in the development and nurturing of healthy and sustainable cities.
- 6. Recognize and build on the distinctive characteristics of cities including their **human and cultural values**, history and natur systems.
- 7. Empower people and foster participation.
- 8. Expand and **enable cooperative networks** to work towards common, sustainable future.
- 9. Promote **sustainable production and consumption**, throug appropriate use of environmentally sound technologies and effective demand management.
- 10. Enable **continual improvement**, based on accountability, transparency and good governance.



City of Saint John – Sustainability Principles

- Provide a **long-term vision** for Saint John based on the pillars of sustainability: social /cultural, environmental and economic.
- Recognize and incorporate the valued and distinctive characteristics of Saint John - including its human, cultural, historical and natural attributes - in our vision and planning for a sustainable city.
- Achieve long-term economic stability and social security in Saint John.
- Engage the entire community of Saint John in the planning and implementation of sustainable solutions.
- Respect Saint John's natural ecosystems. Act as a custodian for the biodiversity and natural ecosystems of Saint John, and protect and restore them.
- Model the development of Saint John on the characteristics of natural systems.
- Strive to minimize Saint John's ecological footprint.
- Foster communication among community groups and organizations to emphasize sustainability as a common shared goal.
- Promote sustainable production and consumption through the use of environmentally sound technologies and effective demand management.
- Establish a systematic process of continual improvement, based on action planning, accountability, transparency and good governance.
