

Kobo eReaders

At a glance:

Best for	Casual and avid readers

These devices are simple to use – great for those new to eReading!

Further details:

- Newer models of *Kobo eReaders* can connect to wireless Internet (Wi-Fi). You can use Wi-Fi to download eBooks directly to your device. Wi-Fi models of the *Kobo* can also browse the Internet.
- You can buy eBooks online from the *Kobo Bookstore*, or you can download them for free from *Electronic Library New Brunswick* via a computer. Any eBooks not from the *Kobo Bookstore* will have to be transferred from your computer to your device via a USB cable.
- You will need to install free software on your computer to manage your eBook collection and to facilitate the transferring of eBooks from the *Electronic Library New Brunswick* to your device.
- *Electronic Library New Brunswick* offers two services for downloading digital content:
 - *OverDrive™* is bilingual but the content is mostly in English.
 - *pretnumerique.ca™* is bilingual but the content is only available in French.

Already Purchased a Kobo eReader? Let's get started!

For initial set-up, follow the directions in the User Manual that came with your device and download any necessary software to your computer (*Kobo Desktop*). It's a good idea to become familiar with all the basic functions of your device.

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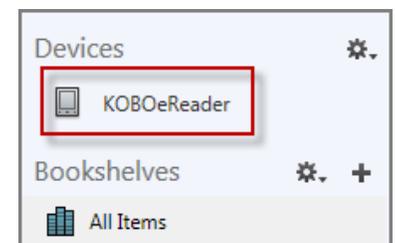
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2. You will now need to access your account. Enter the last 9 digits of your library card number.
3. Browse or search for items you would like to borrow (max. of 5 items).
 - Only one patron can use an item at a time, so you may need to place holds on popular items. You need an email address to place a hold.
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
