

ADAMS POOL

DESCRIPTION

- Location: Lower North Branch Little Southwest Miramichi River
- Stretch type: Regular Crown Reserve
- Stretch length: 8 kilometres
- Number of named pools: 13
- River width: 6-18 metres
- River bottom: rock, boulders
- Additional information: canoeing is **not** advised, rapids, fast water, large boulders. ATV and walking trails are rough, not recommended for elderly people. ATV recommended for upper access trail to camp.

ACCESS (See corresponding numbers on map)

NOTE: Access to certain stretches may require four-wheel drive vehicles.

1. From Sunny Corner, travel north 2.2 km on Route 425. Turn left at Johnson Bridge (Northwest Miramichi River).
2. From Johnson Bridge, travel west 1.5 km. Turn right on Mullin Stream Road.
3. On Mullin Stream Road, travel 2.2 km. Turn left at Y in Mullin Stream Road.
4. From Y in Mullin Stream Road, travel 19.6 km. Cross Mullin Stream.
5. From Mullin Stream Crossing, travel 1.5 km. Turn left at Y in Mullin Stream Road.
6. After turning left at Y in Mullin Stream Road, travel 4.9 km. Cross North Branch Mullin Stream.
7. From North Branch Mullin Stream, travel 15.4 km. Approximately 6 km past the outlet of Guagus Lake, bear right at Y in Mullin Stream Road.
8. From Y in Mullin Stream Road (approximately .6 km past the outlet of Guagus Lake), travel 2.6 km. Turn left onto Adams Camp Road. This road is a 4X4 truck road.
9. On Adams Camp Road, travel 0.7 km to Adams Camp parking area.

ACCOMMODATIONS

- Camp: accommodates four (4) people.
- Beds: four (4) single beds with mattresses.
- Amenities: wood stove, table, sink, benches, broom, mop, and outside toilet facilities.
- Water: no running water. **Anglers must provide their own drinking water.**
- Wired for generator use.
- Incidentals: all equipment not listed above is the responsibility of the angler.
- Firewood is not provided. It is recommended that only kiln dried firewood be brought to Crown Reserve to minimize the risk of spreading invasive insects and disease. If using firewood that has not been kiln dried, buy it locally (as close to your destination as possible), burn it all on site and do not bring any remaining firewood home.
- Garbage removal is the angler's responsibility. Littering is strictly prohibited.

REGULATIONS

- General angling regulations for New Brunswick are in effect. Consult the *Fish* book for additional information.
