

## Attention Regular Crown Reserve Anglers

- Ensure that you carry your Resident Salmon Licence (Class 7, 8, 16 or 17) and some form of identification while fishing on Crown Reserve water.
- All regulations pertaining to salmon angling in the Province of New Brunswick are in effect on Crown Reserve waters.
- Guides are not permitted to fish on these waters unless they are holders of Crown Reserve Licences. Guides cannot hook an Atlantic salmon for a client on Crown Reserve waters.
- Arrival and departure time for Regular Crown Reserve Water camps is 2:00 PM except for the Patapedia stretch which is based on calendar days.
- Clean the camp or campsite for the next party. **Do not litter. You must take your garbage with you.**
- A link to a web based creel census form is included with your Crown Reserve licence package. Party chiefs should use this link to complete their Crown Reserve creel census at the end of their angling trip. If you have requested a paper licence package please return the completed Crown Reserve creel census to Energy and Resource Development using the provided postage paid envelope.

### **MIRAMICHI STRETCH ANGLERS**

- Anglers must release all brook trout caught on the Adams Pool stretch on the Lower North Branch Little Southwest Miramichi River.

### **RESTIGOUCHE STRETCH ANGLERS**

- Anglers are advised to use caution when canoeing the Upsalquitch Forks Pool stretch due to a shift in the riverbed channel that has resulted in stream bank erosion and created the possibility for woody debris and trees in the watercourse.

### **PATAPEDIA STRETCH ANGLERS**

- Canoe or boat travel from 23-Mile Landing downstream to 7-Mile Landing is required to fish the Patapedia stretch. For more information regarding accommodations, transportation, etc., please call the CGRMP office (Corporation de gestion des Rivières Matapédia et Patapédia) in Matapédia at (418) 865-2080.
- **Licences are valid for the upstream zone (Zone 1) on the first day; the middle zone (Zone 2) on the second day and the downstream zone (Zone 3) on the third day - ending at mile 7.**
