

# **STONEY BROOK**

### **DESCRIPTION**

Location: Northwest Miramichi RiverStretch type: Regular Crown Reserve

Stretch length: 6 kilometres
Number of named pools: 11
River width: 13-37 metres

River bottom: rock, large boulders, and ledge

Additional information: Canoeing is not advised. Rapids, falls and fast flowing water and high, very steep banks
in the Narrows and Falls section. Walking trails to Rock Pool and the Falls Pools are very steep, also ATV
trail to Camp Pool. Please note: there is no walking trail above Rock Pool. Anglers must follow the shoreline
to access the upper pools. Caution: access is steep and physically demanding. Anglers should exercise
extreme caution in these areas. Access restricted to four wheel drive vehicles due to steep access road.

## **ACCESS** (See corresponding numbers on map)

**NOTE:** Access to certain stretches may require four-wheel drive vehicles.

- 1. From the city of Miramichi, travel 28.5 km northwest on Route 430 to the Wayerton Bridge (Northwest Miramichi River).
- 2. From Wayerton Bridge, travel 3.5 km to the Fraser Burchill Road (gravel left side).
- 3. On the Fraser Burchill Road, travel 15 km to the Stoney Brook Crown Reserve Road (right side).
- 4. On the Stoney Brook Crown Reserve Road, travel 2.4 km to the first Y in the road. Bear right.
- 5. Afterfirst Y in Stoney Brook Crown Reserve Road, travel 1.8 km to the second Y in the road. Bear right.
- 6. After the second Y in Stoney Brook Crown Reserve Road, travel 2.7 km to the third Y in the road. Bear right.
- 7. After the third Y in Stoney Brook Crown Reserve Road, travel 1.1 km to the fourth Y in the road. Bear left and travel 0.4 km to Stoney Brook Camp.

### **ACCOMMODATIONS**

- Camp: accommodates four (4) people
- Beds: four (4) single beds with mattresses
- Amenities: wood stove, table, sink, benches, broom, mop, and outside toilet facilities
- Water: no running water. Anglers must provide their own drinking water.
- Wired for generator use
- Incidentals: all equipment not listed above is the responsibility of the angler
- Firewood is not provided. It is recommended that only kiln dried firewood be brought to Crown Reserve to
  minimize the risk of spreading invasive insects and disease. If using firewood that has not been kiln dried,
  buy it locally (as close to your destination as possible), burn it all on site and do not bring any remaining
  firewood home.
- Garbage removal is the angler's responsibility. Littering is strictly prohibited.

#### REGULATIONS

- For information on current salmon conservation measures such as live release requirements, visit the Department of Fisheries and Oceans Canada website.
- General angling regulations for New Brunswick are in effect. Consult the *Fish* book for additional information.
