

Please read both sides of this fact sheet before attempting to apply.

Applications are accepted between May 19 and June 12.

End times on June 12:

- Telephone Application Lines - until 7:30 pm AST
- Online Application - until midnight AST
- In person at a vendor - until close of regular business hours

To apply:

1. You must have your principal place of residence in New Brunswick.
2. You must have previous hunting experience or Firearms Safety/Hunter Education course (gun hunters) or a stand-alone Bowhunter Education course (bow/crossbow hunters).
3. You must be 18 years or older at the time of the application.
4. Choose a Wildlife Management Zone (WMZ).
5. Have your **NB Outdoors Card number** ** (please ensure your mailing address associated with this card is up to date) and, method of payment ready.
6. Select one of the options below. **Application fee of \$ 9.55 includes Conservation fee and HST.**

Please note: If you do not have Firearms Safety/Hunter Education and/or Bowhunter Education and are born on or after January 1, 1981 or you are born prior to January 1, 1981 and do not have previous hunting experience, your application will be removed from the draw and the application fee will not be refunded.

The **hours of operation for the telephone application lines** are Monday to Friday from 8:00 am to 7:30 pm and Saturday from 9 am to 1 pm. If you experience difficulties during your call, please stay on the line and an operator will assist you. If you continue to experience difficulty with your application or make an error, please contact Natural Resource and Energy Development (NRED) Fish & Wildlife Branch at (506) 453-3826 during regular business hours (Monday - Friday, 8:15 am to 4:30 pm) before attempting to make another application.

Canadian Forces & Royal Canadian Mounted Police Members

- Canadian Forces and RCMP members residing in New Brunswick may apply for the Resident Moose Draw on line, or in person at an authorized vendor.
- An amendment to the *Fish and Wildlife Act* now allows New Brunswick-born serving members of the Canadian Forces and RCMP to apply for the Resident Moose Draw the same as any New Brunswick resident regardless of where they live or serve. Please contact NRED (506) 453-3826 for more information.

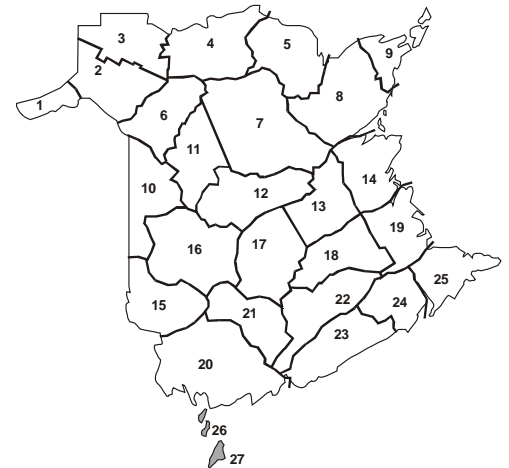
For every five (5) years you have applied unsuccessfully since 1994, you will be placed into a higher pool until you reach Pool 4, where you will remain until you are drawn.

Note: To legally obtain a New Brunswick hunting licence:

- Hunters born on or after January 1, 1981, and all first-time hunters must show proof of a Firearm Safety / Hunter Education Course (gun hunters) or a stand-alone Bowhunter Education course (bow/ crossbow hunters).
- Hunters born previous to 1981 may present a previous hunting licence as proof of hunting experience.
- Conservation Education certificates from other provinces, territories and states are valid in New Brunswick.
- For further information on Firearm Safety/Hunter Education and Bowhunter Education courses, please contact your local NRED district office.

Facts and Figures

A review of moose hunter applications during the last six years (2014 - 2019) revealed the following:

104,008 different individuals have applied at least once during the six (6) year period.

Of these draw applicants:

- 23,966** different residents were successfully drawn once;
- 1,694** different residents were drawn two (2) times;
- 102** residents were drawn three (3) times; and
- 4** residents were drawn four (4) times.
