# Fish and Wildlife Licensing Guide for Non-Resident Bear Licence Allocation Holders

2024 to 2026 Allocation Period

# 1. Introduction

This document describes the process by which non-resident black bear licences allocated to outfitters and guides by the Department of Natural Resources and Energy Development (DNRED) are purchased by their clients using the Fish and Wildlife Licensing System.

## 1.1 What is the Fish and Wildlife Licensing System?

The Fish and Wildlife Licensing System is a web-based or “e-licensing” licensing system. It enables clients to purchase angling, hunting, and trapping licences as well as apply to draws for certain types of hunting licences. The system is available at home using a computer having internet access and printer, at authorized licence vendor locations, or at Service New Brunswick (SNB) Service Centres.

## 1.2 What are the benefits of the Fish and Wildlife Licensing System?

The Fish and Wildlife Licensing System reduces government administrative costs while improving services to the public. One of its primary benefits is that it makes angling, hunting and other related licences and draws available on a 24 hour / 7 day a week basis. This system also aids resource managers in the collection and analysis of licensing data.




Figure 1: The Fish and Wildlife Licensing System site allows registrants to purchase angling, hunting, and trapping licences, or apply to draws for certain types of hunting licences, online.

## 2. Registration

### 2.1 Do my bear hunting clients need to register to use the Fish and Wildlife Licensing System?

Yes - anyone using the licensing system for the first time to apply to a draw or purchase a licence must register. This can be done as a process separate from the licence purchase or as the first step in the initial licence purchase. Registration options include online at the DNRED web site or in person at an authorized vendor location or SNB Service Centre.

## **2.2 As an outfitter can I register a bear hunting client on their behalf?**

Yes - you may register a client in the licensing system provided you have their permission. To do so you must be able to provide the necessary information or documentation on behalf of the registrant as described in Section 3 of this document.

## **2.3 What does registration consist of?**

The following information must be provided during registration:

- Residency status.
- Basic information about the registrant including their name, date of birth, address, and contact information.
- Proof of training or previous possession of a comparable licence.
- An e-mail address if registration is being done online.

Immediately upon registration an Outdoors Card number is issued to the registrant. This number is a permanent identification number that can be used to purchase a licence or apply to a draw in the licensing system. The Outdoors Card number can also be used to register for a Conservation Education course at the DNRED web site.


## **2.4 What is an Outdoors Card?**

All registrants are mailed an Outdoors Card displaying their identification number.

The Outdoors Card is provided so that system users have a convenient reminder of their identification number. Although it is not required at an authorized vendor or SNB location it does speed up the licence transaction. The Outdoors Card does not have to be carried while angling, hunting, or trapping.

## **2.5 How much does an Outdoors Card cost?**

There is no fee to register in the Fish and Wildlife Licensing System for an Outdoors Card number or to be issued an Outdoors Card.

## **2.6 Will non-resident bear hunters need to provide proof of hunter education or bow hunter education training, or of having held a previous hunting licence when registering?**

Yes - proof of hunter or bow hunter education training, or having held a previous comparable hunting licence, must be provided during the registration process for an Outdoors Card number. If a non-resident hunter plans to register for their Outdoors Card number after they have arrived in New Brunswick, they should bring proof of hunter or bow hunter education training, or a previous hunting licence with them.

### **1. Hunters born on, or after, Jan.1, 1981**

Hunters born on, or after Jan.1 1981, and all first-time hunters who register at an authorized vendor or SNB Service Centre must provide documented proof of hunter education or bow hunter education training. If they register online, they must indicate in the licensing system their course reference number, its location, name, and type.

### **2. Hunters born before Jan. 1, 1981**

Hunters born before Jan. 1, 1981, can provide either documented proof of having taken hunter education or bow hunter education training, or a copy of a previous hunting licence if they are registering at an authorized vendor or SNB Service Centre location. They also have the option to sign a certificate of having held a previous hunting licence. If registering online, hunters born before Jan. 1, 1981, can also certify that they have held a previous applicable hunting licence.

Under Section 82.2 of the *Fish and Wildlife Act* the Department of Natural Resources and Energy Development may check a hunter's training qualifications for validity.

## **3. Licence purchase process**

### **3.1 Who can purchase an allocated bear licence from the Fish and Wildlife Licensing System?**

The licensing system is designed to enable the system user to purchase their own licence. However, with respect to non-resident bear licences, outfitters and guides who hold a non-resident bear licence allocation have the ability to purchase a client's hunting licence on their behalf.

### **3.2 Where can allocated non-resident bear licences be purchased?**

Allocated non-resident bear licences can be purchased:

1. Online - visit the [Department of Natural Resources and Energy Development](#) web site.
2. In person at more than 100 authorized [vendor locations](#) around the province.  
For a complete list of licence vendors refer to the Appendix.
3. In person at more than [30 SNB Service Centres](#).

### **3.3 How does a non-resident purchase an allocated bear licence online?**

#### **Step 1: Obtain an Outdoors Card number.**

If the hunter has never registered for an Outdoors Card number before they must do so before they can purchase an allocated bear licence online. To register online they require:

- A computer with Internet access.
- One of the following operating systems:
  - Windows XP, 7 or 8
  - Linus
  - MacOS
- One of the following web browsers:
  - Internet Explorer 9 or higher
  - Mozilla Firefox 23+
  - Google Chrome 28+
  - Apple Safari 5+
- An individual e-mail address that is unique to the user within the licensing system.
- Proof of training if they are a first-time hunter or were born on, or after, Jan. 1, 1981. The hunter is asked to enter their course reference number, location, name, and type of course into the system.

#### **Step 2: Licence purchase**

Once the hunter has registered for their Outdoors Card number, they require the following items to purchase an allocated bear licence online:

- A computer with Internet access and a working printer.
- Adobe Reader to print their licence which is provided in PDF format. This program can be downloaded for free at [Adobe Reader](#).

- Their Outdoors Card number.
- The password they used when they registered in the Fish and Wildlife Licensing System.
- An allocated bear licence code provided to them by their outfitter or guide.
- A tag.
- A method of payment. Options include:
  - VISA
  - MasterCard
  - American Express
  - select Interac® debit cards.

### **3.4 What does a non-resident require to purchase an allocated bear licence at a vendor or SNB Service Centre?**

If the hunter has never registered for an Outdoors Card number before they must register at the vendor or SNB Service Centre before they can purchase a licence. To register they require:

- Identification - a government issued picture ID is recommended.
- Proof of training if they were born on, or after, Jan. 1, 1981, or are a first-time hunter. If born prior to Jan.1, 1981 and they are not a first-time hunter a copy of a previous hunting licence is also accepted. Hunters born prior to Jan. 1, 1981, also have the option of signing a certificate certifying they have held a previous applicable hunting licence.

If the hunter has previously registered in the Fish and Wildlife Licensing System, they require the following items to complete the licence purchase:

- Their Outdoors Card number.
- A bear allocation licence code provided to them by their outfitter or guide.
- A method of payment. Options include:
  - VISA
  - MasterCard
  - American Express,
  - select Interac® debit cards
  - cash.

### **3.5 As an allocation holder what do I need to purchase an allocated bear licence on behalf of a hunting client?**

The requirements for an allocation holder to purchase an allocated bear licence are the same as those if the hunter was buying the licence themselves and are described in Sections 3.3 and 3.4.

Please note:

- If the allocation holder is doing the licence purchase online, the hunter must have previously registered online for their Outdoors Card number. The allocation holder will need their client's Outdoors Card number and their Fish and Wildlife Licensing System password.
- If the allocation holder is doing the licence purchase at an authorized vendor or SNB location, they require the hunter's Outdoors Card number and date of birth.

### **3.6 When can allocated non-resident bear licences be purchased from the Fish and Wildlife Licensing System?**

The purchase period for allocated bear licences is from the first Monday of April until midnight of the first Saturday of November.

### **3.7 Is the cost of buying allocated bear licences the same buying them online compared to at a vendor or SNB service centre?**

Yes – the cost of a non-resident bear licence is the same regardless of how or where it is purchased. Currently the cost is \$163.00 plus HST.

### **3.8 My client has lost their hunting licence. Where can they purchase a replacement licence?**

In the event of a lost or damaged licence, a replacement licence can be reprinted for free from the Fish and Wildlife Licensing System. Licences can also be reissued at vendors or SNB Service Centres, but there is a cost of \$5.25 plus HST.

### 3.9 What if my hunting client wants to buy a second bear licence?

Currently, hunters can purchase a maximum of two bear licences per year.

For non-resident hunters, the second bear licence can only be purchased after the hunter has harvested and registered the first bear.

To purchase a second bear licence the non-resident hunter must enter the number of the *Registration Permit* issued to them for the first bear into the licensing system at the time of licence purchase.

**Registration permit number.**

This 6-digit number is found in the upper right corner of the bear registration permit, which is issued electronically or in paper format. Refer to *Section 7 Other licences and permits* for additional information on the bear registration process. The second bear licence may be an allocated bear licence, or it can be purchased from the licences left over from the non-resident bear draw if any are available. If an allocated bear licence is used for the second licence, the allocation holder must provide the hunter a second bear licence code.

### **3.10 What if I have an unexpected walk-in client who wants to purchase a bear licence?**

Unexpected non-resident clients can purchase an allocated bear licence as long as the allocation holder has an available licence code. If the allocation holder does not have a licence code, it may be possible to request additional licence codes from DNRED. A second option is to purchase a bear licence left over from the non-resident bear draw.

### **3.11 What is to stop someone from just going online and buying one of my allocated non-resident bear licences?**

Each allocated non-resident bear licence is uniquely coded and can only be purchased by the person who has that code.

### **3.12 Can my client purchase their hunting licence using a smart phone?**

Yes - hunting licences can be purchased using a mobile device such as a smart phone. However, the licence purchaser must ensure a paper copy of the licence is printed, signed, and carried by them during the hunt. Current law prohibits the use of a cell phone as an alternative means to show proof of holding an angling, hunting, or trapping licence.

### **3.13 What if my client purchases their licence at home but then cancels their hunting trip?**

In the event of a hunting trip cancellation, the licence holder may submit a refund request to the provincial Draws Administrator, Fish and Wildlife Branch. Refund requests will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis. Approvals are not guaranteed and will be limited to exceptional circumstances only. Allocation holders will be able to request a replacement allocation licence code in the event of a cancelled hunt. Refer to Section 6 for additional information. about licence codes.

# 4. Licence format

## 4.1 What does a hunting licence issued by the Fish and Wildlife Licensing System look like?

All licences purchased through the Fish and Wildlife Licensing System are printed on an 8 ½ x 11-inch sheet of paper. In addition to standard licensing information, allocated bear licences also state the name of the licence allocation holder, the bear tag number associated with the licence, and the Wildlife Management Zone which the licence is valid for.

As additional angling or hunting licences are purchased, they all appear on the same sheet of paper. Licences must be signed once printed and be in the hunter’s possession while they are hunting.

## 4.2 Is this licence format recognized as a valid hunting licence when non-resident bear hunters cross the Canada / USA border?

Yes - this licence is recognized as a valid hunting licence by officials at the Canada / USA border crossing.

## 5. Bear tags

### 5.1 Is the bear tag attached to the hunting licence?

No - the tag used with the Fish and Wildlife Licensing System is separate from the licence. Tags have two parts, an adhesive label and a metal wire, and are designed so that they can be used for bear, deer, moose, turkey, or salmon.

Tagging instructions are found on the back of the adhesive label. For bear, deer, and moose:

1. Insert the wire through the skin of the right foreleg.
2. Peel back the liner of the tag and place the wire on half of the sticky side of the tag.
3. Fold the tag over the ends of the wire and apply pressure so that the two halves stick to one another.




Figure 5: Front and reverse side of a tag used with the Fish and Wildlife Licensing system.

When tagging a turkey, a wire is not required. The sticky side of the tag is wrapped around either of its legs.

### 5.2 Does my client need a tag to purchase an allocated bear hunting licence?

Yes - a tag is required to purchase an allocated bear licence. If the hunter is purchasing a licence online, they must obtain a tag prior to the licence purchase. If the licence is being purchased at a vendor or SNB Service Centre a tag will be provided for them.

Allocation holders may provide a tag number, rather than the actual tag, to a non-resident client who wishes to purchase their hunting licence online from home. However, the hunter must be provided the corresponding tag by the allocation holder and carry their tag and licence with them to legally hunt in New Brunswick. In addition, the species, year, and name of the hunter must be written on the tag prior to its use.

### **5.3 Where can I obtain tags for my clients?**

Allocation holders can contact their local DNRED office for tags used by their outfitting business.

## **6. Bear allocation licence codes**

### **6.1 What is a bear allocation licence code and how is it used?**

Licence codes are the means by which allocation holders enable their non-resident hunting clients to purchase bear licences allocated to their business. During the purchase of an allocated non-resident bear licence, a licence code must be entered into the Fish and Wildlife Licensing System to complete the licence transaction. Once used a licence code cannot be reused. Each licence code represents a single allocated non-resident bear licence.

### **6.2 How will I receive my licence codes?**

Licence codes are issued annually to allocation holders by the Fish and Wildlife Branch by mail or e-mail, depending on the allocation holder's choice. Licence codes are released to allocation holders only after it has been determined they have met their annual eligibility requirements for holding a non-resident bear licence allocation.

### **6.3 Is there a fee to be issued licence codes?**

No - allocation holders do not pay a fee to be issued licence codes.

### **6.4 What do the codes consist of?**

The format for a bear allocation licence code is:

#### **1. First two digits**

The year for which the code is valid.

25-10-78450

#### **2. Second two digits**

The Wildlife Management Zone for which the code and bear licence apply.

#### **3. Final five digits**

A random unique number that is specific to that licence code.

### **6.5 Will I be able to share my licence codes with other allocation holders?**

No - licence codes are only for use by the allocation holder to whom they have been issued. DNRED, at its discretion, may check the use of allocated non-resident bear licences to determine which outfitting business used the licence code. This includes, field checks by Conservation Officers to determine if the non-resident hunter is actually using the services of the outfitting business identified on their allocated non-resident bear hunting licence.

### **6.6 How do I track the use of my licence codes?**

Allocation holders are provided a master list of licence codes by DNRED prior to the start of the spring bear season. It is the allocation holder's responsibility to track those codes which have been used to sell allocated non-resident bear licences. Licence codes are randomly generated on a year-to-year basis and are not reusable from one year to the next.

### **6.7 What if I lose track of which licence codes I've used, or I need more?**

If an allocation holder loses track of the licence codes they've used, or they need additional licence codes they should contact the provincial Draws Administrator at the Fish and Wildlife Branch. Licence code lists and new licence codes will only be sent to allocation holders at the e-mail address they have provided DNRED for this purpose and will **NOT** be provided by phone. Allocation holders who do not have an e-mail address may obtain updated licence code lists or new codes by contacting their local DNRED office or the Fish and Wildlife Branch.

### **6.8 One of my bear hunting clients cancelled their hunt after purchasing an allocated bear licence. What happens to the bear licence code they used? Will I be issued a replacement code?**

In the event of a hunting trip cancellation allocation holders can request a replacement code for the sold licence(s). Inquiries about replacement codes should be directed to the provincial Draws Administrator at the Fish and Wildlife Branch.

## 7. Other licences and permits

### 7.1 Can I register a bear harvested by my client online?

Yes - but registration must be done at the [Big Game Registration Portal](#) instead of through the Fish and Wildlife Licensing System. To register a bear online, you must be able to print and sign the Registration Permit that you will be issued. Also, a tooth must be collected from the animal and delivered to a DNRED office within 14 days of the online registration.

Bear can also be registered in person by the allocation holder if they have been authorized to act as a bear registration agent, or at an official bear registration station. In-person registration is based on a paper rather than digital form. Contact your local DNRED office for information on how to have your outfitting business set up to register bears.

### 7.2 Are permits that I require as an outfitter such as CITES and meat transfer permits available through the Fish and Wildlife Licensing System?

No - not at this time. However, it is anticipated that the system will eventually include these types of permits. Allocation holders will be informed of these changes prior to their implementation.

### 7.3 Some of my bear hunters want to purchase a non-resident fishing licence. How do I know what specific types of non-resident hunting and fishing licences are available for purchase through the Fish and Wildlife Licensing System?

The types of licences available for purchase are displayed by selecting the *Purchase a Licence* section once you log in to your hunter's profile. These are determined by the licence purchaser's qualifications such as age, residency, and training.

## 8. Becoming a licence vendor

### 8.1 Are outfitters eligible to become a licence vendor?

Yes - any business that wishes to sell hunting and fishing licences can apply to the Fish and Wildlife Branch to become a licence vendor. Vendors must review and agree to a set of requirements identified in the Vendor Agreement document. Please visit the [Becoming a vendor](#) link for further details related to the application process.

## **8.2 What are the pros and cons of becoming a licence vendor?**

Allocation holders that become a licence vendor can provide a broader range of licensing services to their bear hunting clients. Their clients can purchase non-resident hunting and fishing licences directly from the outfitter rather than having to do it themselves from home or travel to a licence vendor or SNB Service Centre location. Licence vendors also receive a small commission for each licence sold.

These advantages should be weighed against the cost associated with becoming a licence vendor. For example, licence vendors require a reliable computer, printer, and Internet access. There will also be costs associated with the printing of licences.

Licence vendors have specific responsibilities such as ensuring their staff are familiar with the Fish and Wildlife Licensing System registration and licence sales process. Licence vendors also need to make banking arrangements so that funds related to licence sales can be electronically transferred to Service New Brunswick.

# **9. Technical issues**

## **9.1 What happens if the Fish and Wildlife Licensing system goes down?**

If the licensing system is down for more than 24 hours, a back-up manual system will be put in place and licences will be available for purchase from SNB Service Centres. The non-resident bear hunter will still require a licence code to purchase an allocated bear licence from this system.

## **9.2 What are issues my bear hunting clients might encounter that would prevent them from buying a licence online? How can they be resolved?**

### **1. Forgotten Outdoors Card number**

If the hunter is buying a licence at an authorized vendor or SNB Service Centre, a sales agent can locate their account based on other information such as the hunter's name or date of birth. If the hunter has a printed copy of a previous hunting licence or a registration confirmation, they can find their Outdoors Card number on these documents.

## **3. Forgotten password**

Click on the *Forgot password* link and enter the e-mail address used during registration. An e-mail will be sent to the user with instructions on how to reset their password.

## **4. My client has previously registered at a vendor or SNB Service Centre and now wants to purchase a hunting licence online for the first time.**

If your hunting client registered at a vendor or SNB Service Centre but has not purchased a licence online before, they must set up their account to access the Fish and Wildlife Licensing System online. To do this they need to click on the *Become an Online User* button at the [Fish and Wildlife Licensing System](#) site and follow the instructions provided there.
