Why is this area under consideration?

This candidate site would add 570 protected hectares (ha) to eastern Charlotte County. Situated in the Magaguadavic River Watershed, Lake Anthony is one lake in a chain of lakes and streams in the area. Large granite cliffs and boulders are featured in the interior of this site, making for spectacular views.

QUICK FACTS

 420 ha of old Red Spruce, Tolerant Hardwoods, and White Pine forest is found in this Candidate Conserved Area.

• The site features 115 ha of floodplains, riparian habitat, lakes, and streams, including Lake Anthony and Newton Lakes that provide habitat for Rainbow Smelt, Atlantic Salmon, and Brook Trout.

 There are a number of waterfalls along Lake Anthony Brook.

 Wet terrain provides a home to two carnivorous plants, the Northern Pitcher Plant and the Spoon-leaved Sundew.
