HEADWATERS OF THE PENNIAC STREAM

Why is this area under consideration?

The Penniac Stream is a tributary of Nashwaak River and is known for its natural, cultural and recreation values. This site would add 1,880 hectares (ha) of protection in the headwaters of the stream.

QUICK FACTS

- 1,630 ha of Old Forest composed of Balsam Fir, Spruce, and Red Maple suitable for mammal species such as lynx and fisher.
- Provides protection on the headwaters of the Penniac Stream, including wetlands that contain overwintering habitat for moose and ideal amphibian and turtle habitat.
- Would enhance the protection of habitat for at-risk bird species like the Olive-sided flycatcher.
- Ensure the protection of a watershed that is relatively undeveloped.
