

SCOPE OF THE OCCUPATION

The industrial mechanic (millwright) occupation includes

- (a) the applying of accident prevention principles, practices and techniques;
- (b) the installing, maintaining, repairing and commissioning of mechanical, hydraulic, pneumatic, fuel, lubrication, cooling and exhaust systems and equipment in industrial plants;
- (c) the performing of the basic functions of carpentry, welding, pipefitting, rigging, electrical and machine work;
- (d) the using of precision measuring tools to perform equipment analysis, alignment and levelling; and
- (e) the interpreting of blueprints, schematic drawings, operation manuals and specifications to determine work procedures.
