

# Canadian Adult Education Credential (CAEC) Prior Learning Assessment & Recognition (PLAR) Guidelines for New Brunswick

Certain high school courses from the New Brunswick school system can be recognized as prior learning, giving candidates an exemption from writing certain CAEC tests. At least one CAEC test must be written and passed by the candidate. In other words, this process cannot be used towards all 5 subjects. Please consult the table below for courses that can be used to be exempted from writing CAEC tests by subject.

### Other Recognition Criteria:

- Courses with ENR or CIC are not acceptable.
- Courses with CREDIT or PASS are acceptable.
- Adjusted (ADJ), Modified (MOD), or Individualized (IND) courses are not acceptable.
- Courses from independent or private schools, or home schooling are not acceptable.
- Locally Developed Courses (LCD) may be considered. They will be considered on a case-bycase basis, provided a detailed curriculum is available.
- The above list may exclude courses that have been retired or those whose names or numbers have changed. Such courses will be assessed on case-by-case basis.
- Courses from other provinces may be considered on a case-by-case basis. Courses from other countries will not be considered.

# **GED Test Recognition**

Successfully completed GED tests, from the 2002 Canadian GED Testing Series, can also be used towards the CAEC for a period of up to 3 years, until May 2027. Other series of the GED Testing Series cannot be used.
