



The Lepreau Emergency Notification System: What you need to know

The New Brunswick Emergency Measures Organization (NB-EMO) has an emergency notification system in place for your safety. Through this system, we can pass along important emergency-related messages to residents within a 20-kilometre radius of the Point Lepreau Nuclear Generating Station.

It's crucial that residents know how to use the system and to confirm receipt of emergency messages.

The following instructions will guide you through the process when an emergency notification test is performed, or during an actual event.

Receiving messages

- When you see **NB EMO / OMU NB 453-2133 or Unknown name 453-2133** on your telephone call display, this means the call is coming from NB-EMO.
- When you answer the phone, you will hear: *"The following is a message from the New Brunswick Emergency Measures Organization"*, then a computer-generated voice will ask you to hit "1" to listen to the message.
- When you receive an emergency notification message, listen to the entire message.

Confirming receipt of messages

- Listen to the message, and then wait for confirmation instructions: "To confirm receipt of this message, please hit 1."
or
- If you receive the message on your voice mail or answering machine, the message will include a phone number (1-866-505-4912) and a confirmation number. Call the number, enter the language (1 for English, 2 for French) and when prompted, enter your confirmation number and hit the pound (#) key.
