

Safer Communities Report 2021 - 2022

The Department of Justice and Public Safety is committed to informing the public on ongoing efforts to protect the public. In budget 2021-22, the Government of New Brunswick committed \$2.3 million to support the RCMP crime reduction unit with the goal of reducing the illegal drug supply in the province and \$2 million to create a Safer Communities Program to complement the crime reduction unit.
