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## INTRODUCTION

In publishing the first-ever *Annual Report on Fees* in 2009, the Minister of Finance is completing the last step in meeting a commitment contained in the *Charter for Change* in 2006. The *Charter for Change* included a promise to introduce a *Fees Act* to bring fee changes to the Legislative Assembly for public debate, and to provide suitable notice of upcoming changes to the public.

In keeping with this commitment, a new piece of legislation was researched and drafted. The *Fees Act* (see **Appendix A** or <http://www.gnb.ca/0062/PDF-acts/f-08-5.pdf>) received Royal assent on April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2008. Public debate and public notice are central to the new act. The legislation not only establishes a transparent process governing fees charged by government departments, but it is also designed to address the concerns of stakeholder groups who expressed dissatisfaction in the past with sudden fee increases.

The new act applies to Part I of the public service. It requires detailed information to be made public on all upcoming fee increases and all new fees at least 60 days before implementation by government departments.

The act also specifies that, by January 31<sup>st</sup> each year, the Minister of Finance must file a document containing such information with the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly. This document contains detailed information regarding new fees and fee increases planned by government departments for the upcoming fiscal year of 2009-2010.

The report also includes information such as the legal authority to charge each fee, the current fee amount, the new fee amount, the effective date of the change, revenue details and departmental contact information.

The first section in the 2009 report summarizes fee changes and/or new fees approved by the provincial Board of Management between the coming into force of the *Fees Act* and publication of this report. These take effect prior to April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2009.

The second section summarizes upcoming fee changes and/or new fees that have already been approved by the Board of Management for the fiscal year 2009-2010. In keeping with the requirement of 60-day minimum notice to the public, none will take effect until at least April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2009.

It should be noted that the *Fees Act* does allow departments to create or increase fees during the upcoming fiscal year. If this occurs, the individual department will file a document with the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly containing the same type of details as are contained in this report. The fee change is also subject to the requirement of a minimum 60-day notice to the public.

In summary, the key commitments in the *Charter for Change* – public debate and public notice about fee increases – have been met by implementation of the *Fees Act* and by the publication of this *Annual Report on Fees*.

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## How to Read This Report

Section 3(2) of the *Fees Act* requires this *Annual Report on Fees* to present the following information for new and increased fees proposed for the next fiscal year:

- (a) the name of the department that proposed the fee
- (b) the name of the fee
- (c) the legislative authority for the fee
- (d) the amount of the current fee, if any
- (e) the amount of the new fee or the increased fee
- (f) the effective date for the new fee or the increased fee
- (g) the total annual revenue expected from the fee
- (h) the change in the annual revenue expected from the fee, and
- (i) the name of the contact person.

In this report, the above information is presented in the following format:

Readers should note that “New Annual Revenue Estimate” presents the total expected revenue from the fee at the proposed or increased rate for the upcoming fiscal year. “Change in Annual Revenue” indicates how much additional annual revenue is expected per fiscal year from the new fee rate, as opposed to the prior rate.

While the Minister of Finance is responsible to file this document each January with the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly, information about particular fees should always be obtained from the specific departments and contacts listed in the description of each fee.

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<p><b>Comments:</b> Traditionally, property in New Brunswick has been registered under the <i>Registry Act</i> for a cost of \$65, but this registry does not provide a guarantee of land ownership. In 2000, Service New Brunswick introduced a guaranteed land title registry, which provides that guarantee of land ownership. This new service, provided under the <i>Land Titles Act</i>, charges \$60 for registration, plus \$5 for the assurance fee, for a total of \$65 to match that charged under the <i>Registry Act</i>.</p> <p>The assurance fund (the aggregation of all the \$5 fees paid in the province) is used to pay any land title claims against the Province. Since 2000, the assurance fund has grown to \$3.2M while only \$61,000 has been needed to pay out settlements. As such, the assurance fee can be reduced by \$2 from \$5 to \$3 going forward. The Land Titles registration fee will be increased by \$2 from \$60 to \$62 in order to maintain an equivalent \$65 fee as prescribed in the <i>Registry Act</i>.</p>

The Vital Statistics Registry function of Service New Brunswick, which administers these licences, runs an annual operating deficit of \$458,534. Issuing a marriage licence is a costly, labour intensive process as it includes the verification of information and individual interviews with each party. New Brunswick is the only jurisdiction in Canada that does not charge a fee for a marriage licence.

This fee increase will offset the operating deficit and the new revenue will allow Service New Brunswick to invest in the modernization of the Vital Statistics Registry, provide richer online services and ultimately transform it from a paper to an electronic registry.

Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick, enacts as follows:

#### Definitions

1 The following definitions apply in this Act.

“department” means a portion of the Public Service specified in Part I of the First Schedule of the *Public Service Labour Relations Act*. (ministère)

“fee” means a fee, levy, royalty or other charge fixed by regulation under the authority of a public Act of the Province. (droit)

#### Application of the Act

2 This Act applies to all fees proposed by departments.

#### Annual report on fees

3(1) On or before January 31 in each fiscal year, the Minister of Finance shall file an annual report on fees with the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly.

3(2) The annual report shall contain the following information for every new fee and increase in a fee proposed for the next fiscal year:

- (a) the name of the department that proposed the fee;
- (b) the name of the fee;
- (c) the legislative authority for the fee;
- (d) the amount of the current fee, if any;
- (e) the amount of the new fee or the increased fee;
- (f) the effective date for the new fee or the increased fee;
- (g) the total annual revenue expected from the fee;
- (h) the change in the annual revenue expected from the fee; and
- (i) the name of the contact person.

**3(3)** The effective date for any new fee or increased fee shall be not less than 60 days after the annual report is filed.

**3(4)** The annual report shall also contain information regarding the fees introduced, changed or eliminated since the previous annual report.

### **Other reports on fees**

**4(1)** If a new fee or an increase in a fee is proposed during a fiscal year and the fee is not included in the annual report referred to in subsection 3(1), the Minister responsible for the Act that authorizes the fee shall file a report with the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly at least 60 days before the effective date for the new fee or the increased fee.

**4(2)** The report shall contain the information referred to in subsection 3(2).

**N.B.** This Act is consolidated to April 30, 2008.
